

Video Dog Goldberg Machine

1. Make copies of the sentences on pages 2-5 and cut them up (enough for each student to have one piece of paper).
2. Put students into groups of ten and give them one piece of paper each. If the number of students in your class is not a multiple of ten, make smaller groups where some students have more than one piece of paper.
3. Tell students to use dictionaries to check the meaning of any vocabulary they don't understand.
4. Say that they're going to watch a video. Afterwards, they should stand in the order their actions on their paper appear in the video.
5. Play the video. Students put themselves in order from the beginning to the end. Tell them to do it by speaking, not by reading the other students' papers. (If a student has two nonconsecutive actions, they can simply pass one of them down the line until it gets to the right place.)
6. Once they're standing in order, play the video again so that they can check.
7. Tell them to sit down again and hand out a copy of the whole text on page 6 for students to read.
8. Now say that they're going to improve the text so that it doesn't sound like ten separate parts, but a cohesive unit. Can they think of any changes they can make?
9. If not, tell them that one thing they can do is to add some linking words and phrases. Can they think of anything else? Hopefully somebody will mention pronouns/relative pronouns. Go through the first few examples with the class (suggestions to display on page 7). Students then work on the rest of the text in pairs.
10. When they've finished, have some open class feedback on the changes and congratulate them on improving the text. Show them the suggested model (page 8, linking words in blue, everything else in red) to see similarities and differences. Emphasise that this is only ONE suggestion - there are infinite suggestions that can be made!
